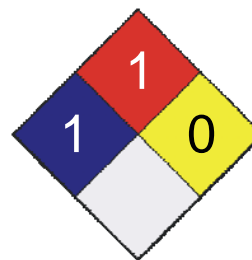

## 2. Hazards Identification

**Emergency overview** WARNING  
 EYE IRRITANT. Skin irritation possible with prolonged exposure.  
 Contains a potential mutagen.

**Potential short term health effects**

**Routes of exposure** Eye, Skin contact, Skin absorption, Inhalation, Ingestion.

## 4. First Aid Measures

**First aid procedures**
